### Headteacher's Message



Christmas is here! There is a lovely buzz of excitement around school! The Christmas productions have been amazing as always and wonderful to see so many of you here enjoying them, the children really did do us proud. I would like to say a huge thank you to Ms Draper and the staff who worked very hard to make these so successful. Thank you for joining us and for your very kind donations of mince pies and goodies!

This term we are saying goodbye to Danielle Goodayle who has a new job as Assistant Headteacher at Dame Ellen Pincet School, many congratulations to Danielle, we wish her well and shall miss her at Chadsgrove. I would like to take this opportunity to thank Danielle both for her commitment and dedication to our school.

Father Christmas visited school last week and enjoyed being in his grotto, which is our newly refurbished Multi-Sensory Room! The children all loved their visits to see him and their presents!

Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> December was our Christmas dinner day, another delicious dinner thanks to our superb team in the kitchen! Everyone enjoyed the meal and the after dinner entertainment!

This has been a fabulous year for Chadsgrove, as well as celebrating our 40th birthday we have opened a new 19-25 provision for young people with physical disabilities and complex medical needs, and are also delighted to have 2 new classrooms ready to move into, funded by Worcestershire County Council and built by Arden Construction.

The 19-25 'Education Learning Centre' provision is the first of its kind in Worcestershire and will provide outstanding education and care for some of our most vulnerable young people. Catherine Driscoll (Director of Children, Families and Community – Worcestershire County Council) opened the Centre and was joined by families, Worcestershire County Council staff, staff from the school, Governors and key people instrumental in getting the provision in place.

A time capsule was buried on the new build site under a sundial and contained something momentous from every class. I also put in a photograph of the 3 Headteachers who have led the school over the last 40 years, David Nicholas between 1976-1990, Richard Aust between 1990-2009 and myself, Headteacher since 2009.

We would like to thank all who have been involved in both the new 19-25 provision and the building of the 2 new classrooms, both buildings are a wonderful addition to the school and will enable us to continue to provide outstanding education and care to all our pupils and young people.

I would like to say a huge thank you to you all for your amazing support and generosity over the year; it is much appreciated. Thank you too, on behalf of the staff, for all the gifts and cards that have been sent into school.

I hope you have a wonderful Christmas break. Merry Christmas and a very Happy New Year!

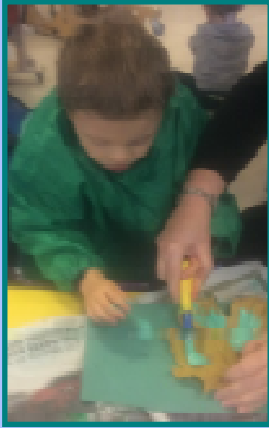

### Chadsgrove School Choir Help Launch Bromsgrove's Festive Season

Pupils in Chadsgrove School Choir braved the bitterly cold weather in mid-November with two separate performances in Bromsgrove town centre. The first was part of the St. John's Christmas Market, and we collected just over £100 for Children in Need! The second was the following day, and we were the first to perform at the town's Christmas Lights Switch On event. A huge well done to the choir, and a big thank you to parents, families and friends who supported these events!

In November we were delighted to welcome the Pearl of Africa Choir into school. They did two lively performances for us, and had everyone joining in with percussion instruments. They also taught us a traditional Ugandan song, and were selling beautiful hand-made crafts. The choir tours around Britain for 3 months, raising money for Pearl of Africa Child Care. This is a UK based charity whose main activity is raising funds to provide education, food, shelter and healthcare to orphaned and destitute children in the Kampala and Masaka districts. We would very much like to welcome them into school again when they are touring next year!
