National Professional Qualification for Senior Leadership (NPQSL)

May or June 2018 Start

The National Professional Qualification for Senior Leadership (NPQSL) is a qualification that provides national recognition of your leadership development and professional achievement as a senior leader with cross-school responsibilities.

Who can apply?

You should be a current or aspiring senior leader in a school with the responsibility of leading across a school and interested in finding out more about the best way to do so. For example: experienced middle leaders, deputy headteachers, assistant headteachers

Programme outline – 'Leading a across a school'

The NPQSL programme typically takes up to one year to complete, during which time participants will complete six areas of study:

- Working in partnership
- Managing resources and risk
- Strategy and improvement
- Teaching and curriculum excellence
- Increasing capacity
- Leading with impact

In addition to the six areas of study, there are also seven leadership behaviours which set out how a leader should operate on a daily basis. These are:

- Commitment
- Collaboration
- Personal drive
- Awareness

- Respect
- Resilience Integrity

Programme outline:

Our NPQ programmes are designed around a blended learning approach which incorporates face to face days, online courses and collaborative study.

Assessment:

The WGLA is working in partnership with the University of Worcester to deliver final assessment at the completion of the NPQSL programme. The NPQSL will carry 'Recognition of Prior Learning' (RPL) credits that can be put towards a masters programme.

There are three elements to the award of the NPQSL:

- Completion of all the online courses
- Attendance at all face to face days
- Final assessment of a school improvement project: Working across the school to reduce variation in pupil progress and attainment and improving the efficiency and effectiveness of teaching.
