Support packages will be devised in consultation with the school's Senior Leadership Team, and may be commissioned using pre-purchased agreements or on a pay-as-you go basis. Pre-purchased units represent a generous saving compared to pay-as-you-go. Once units have been purchased, we will maintain an account for the school. <u>tsa@chadsgrove.worcs.sch.uk</u> We will then contact you to establish appropriate content of the support package and number of units to be applied.



The team is made up of specialist teachers experienced in working with children and young people with a range of special educational and additional needs. The team are qualified to diagnose dyslexia and dyscalculia and are also a key component of the Dyspraxia Motorway.

The team carry out assessments to identify challenges to educational progress and make recommendations based upon their findings. These recommendations may include individualised programmes of support, approaches and strategies, classroom support and advice on inclusive practice.

### **Speech & Language Therapy Services**

The ability to communicate is an essential life skill for all children and young people and it underpins a child's social, emotional and educational development. Strong language and communication skills are linked to better outcomes for children and young people in school and beyond.

10% of all children have long term or persistent speech language and communication needs (SLCN) – the most prevalent special educational need identified by primary schools. The Children's Speech and Language Therapy Service is commissioned by the NHS and Worcestershire County Council to deliver services at a targeted and specialist level to children attending mainstream schools, working in partnership with the wider workforce to meet children's needs. Additional services from direct therapy to whole setting/school training and everything in between are available to be commissioned by schools to enhance their core service. Some aspects of this are now available through Chadsgrove School Support Team.

### **Paediatric Occupational Therapy Services**

Occupational Therapists are professionals who enable children and young people to participate fully in all aspects of life whether this be completing handwriting activities, playing with their peers, accessing their environment or managing in the classroom and wider school environment.

Occupational Therapy input can take the form of support and assessment of individual children, environmental assessments, staff training, and development of programmes or blocks of one to one or small group therapy. The table below describes a range of therapy options but bespoke options can be devised to meet the needs of individual children or schools.

### **Play Therapy**

The team is made up of qualified play therapists experienced in working with children and young people with a range of presenting behaviours.

The team are able to carry out assessments to identify the emotional needs of pupils and how these are impacting on learning and behaviour. Recommendations may include individual therapy, therapy to include family members, therapeutic group work, group therapy or tailored staff training in responding therapeutically to children displaying distressed behaviour.

Play therapy is a gentle yet effective technique which can lead the child on a life changing journey to a more hopeful and positive place.

#### How do I know which of my pupils would benefit from/need Play Therapy?

#### Do you know a child who ...?

- Suffers because of separated/divorced parents?
- Is withdrawn or continually unhappy?
- Finds it difficult to make friends?
- Quarrels frequently with peers or siblings?
- Bullies others or is bullied themselves?
- Displays inappropriate or challenging behaviour?
- Is not realising their full potential academically, or socially?

- Has nightmares or has disturbed sleep?
- Has witnessed Domestic Violence?
- Is at risk of being/is excluded from school?
- Has suffered trauma or a loss / bereavement
- Has suffered emotional, physical or sexual abuse?
- Is adopted or fostered or in the process of being?
- Suffers from anxiety, stress or phobias?

### Visual Impairment and Multi-Sensory Impairment

### **SENCO Strategic Support**

As the new SEND reforms become established, the SENCO role includes increasing strategic responsibilities, including evaluations of the effectiveness of support provided to ensure progress is made by pupils with SEND.

We can offer support, guidance and advice for SENCOs in the progression, monitoring and evaluation of school systems and SEND policy. This may include support with effective data collection and tracking for children with SEND, monitoring the delivery of high quality differentiated teaching, and advice on supporting the identification of pupils with SEND and implementing appropriate interventions.

Support is offered at the following rates:

Half-day £270 (6 units) Full-day £585 (12 units)

#### **SENCO Network**

The SENCO Network led by Lorraine Petersen OBE is firmly established as a highly valued resource, providing regular updates, expert advice and interactive discussion to enable SENCOs to develop effective practice. Because the SENCO role is unique within schools, it may feel isolated. Meetings offer the chance to share concerns, get advice on specific issues and identify good practice with colleagues.

Membership of the SENCO Network includes attendance at termly meetings, a termly newsletter with important updates on SEN policy, and one delegate place at the annual SENCO conference hosted by CTSA. Membership runs from 1<sup>st</sup> September each year. A reduction in fee may be made for those that join part way through an academic year.

Membership costs:

£200 for 12 months

A team of experienced and professionally qualified Career Advisers who are registered with the Career Development Institute, and accredited with the Matrix Quality Standard for Information, Advice and Guidance. The team's aims are:

- To afford the school every support that is deemed necessary and desirable in the support of the students and those responsible for them
- To deliver effectively and rigorously careers information, advice and guidance to young people; to maximise their life opportunities by promoting and enhancing participation and inclusion
- To offer additional, intensive support to the more vulnerable young people. Our vision is to sustain these students within the school setting; to help them to participate in the development of strategies in order to achieve a positive outcome; and to ensure that all may become engaged with a variety of employment, education and training opportunities
- To provide a high quality service that is universal yet tailored to the individual, so that all the young people may achieve good outcomes and reach their full potential, recognising however, some young people will need more support as they make that transition
- The services we can provide include:
- Careers guidance interviews including a full action plan
- Group work choose from a range of topics such as employability workshops, apprenticeships and occupational awareness
- Work with parents and carers at parents' evenings
- Drop in sessions
- Careers fair/employer events
- Careers, information and guidance training for your staff
- Tracking & follow up service that includes completion of your September Guarantee and Annual Activity returns and production of a Destination Report
- Specifically tailored Career Action Plans that link directly into Education, Health & Care Plans for your students with special educational needs
- Attendance at A Level and GCSE results day

### **Physical Disability Team** (not available within Worcestershire)

The Physical Disability (PD) Team support children with a physical disability (e.g. cerebral palsy, dystrophy, acquired brain injuries, tumours, arthritis, hyper-mobility and developmental coordination difficulties). This specialist teaching team is available to support mainstream schools and early years settings (transfer support onto further and higher education settings is also available). We recognise the importance of working collaboratively with colleagues in mainstream schools and health settings, Parents/Carers and children to:

- Enable children and young people with physical disabilities to be educated in mainstream schools wherever possible
- Provide appropriate support for children with physical disabilities, their Parents/Carers and school staff to achieve successful, inclusive education
- Offer advice and training to help maintain access to a full curriculum
- Complete specialist assessments
- Assist with all aspects of planning and implementing access for children with limited mobility, including building modifications

The PD Team support children through: school and pre-school visits, transition planning; contributing to Statutory Assessment; reviews, IEPs and programmes of work; advice on the development of inclusive teaching strategies; specialist assessments; intervention programmes; staff training; curriculum support; advice on specific environmental adaptations to promote inclusion; advising on special arrangements for examinations where appropriate; working with pupils to develop strategies for independent learning; Teaching Assistant support; inclusive technology; manual handling assessments.


