Headteacher's Message

Well it really is May half term, however, the weather at the time of writing this newsletter would suggest otherwise!















2LS have been learning how

3LS






3LS have taken part in virtual PE lessons with students from Worcester University.





Children's picture book author/illustrator *Ellie Sandall* will be running workshops with **6LS** and **8LS**.


6LS are studying '*Everybunny Dream!*' and 8LS are working on another of Ellie's beautiful books, '*Copycat Bear'*.



WARNING OVER NEW CRAZE FOR FAKE TONGUE PIERCINGS WITH MAGNETIC BALLS

A PLAYGROUND craze for fake tongue piercings using magnetic balls almost killed three kids in a matter of weeks.

Top surgeon Sanja Besarovic has warned parents about the dangerous fad that is putting large numbers of kids in danger.

She said three children have been treated at Hull Royal Infirmary in the past three months after swallowing high powered ball-bearing magnets.

Youngsters are attempting to mimic tongue and cheek piercings, unaware that the magnets stick to each other through loops of gastrointestinal tract.

The stunt could cause bowel perforation or intestinal blockage if they are swallowed.
