
4LS

6LS



7LS at the Seaside!




We cooled ourselves with the fans in the hot sun, we put our flags on top of our sandcastles and we had fun on the carousel at the fair!

7LS enjoyed joining in our sensory story '7LS at the Seaside!'




8LS




9US

Jasmine enjoyed drawing a house in the forest




Mollie took orienteering very seriously. Here she is plotting her next destination.

We discovered lots about Tokyo – in class we engaged in a traditional fan dance- Dominik really enjoyed waving his fan along to the music!




Louis practising his co-ordination skills for the skittle event! It paid off as he won a silver medal on the day. Well done Louis!



POP Up SEND Literacy Festival

As part of our ‘*Pop Up SEND Literacy Festival*’ project, over the summer term, four classes have been immersing themselves in creative reading and writing activities inspired by the texts of two published children’s authors, **Ian Billings** and **Ellie Sandall**.

Our ‘*Pop Up Festival*’ culminated in four inspiring interactive workshops by the authors of our chosen books.

Ian Billings:

Children’s comedian, author and poet, Ian Billings, used all of his performance skills and experience (as a former writer for ‘Chuckle-Vision’) to deliver entertaining, energetic and extremely funny workshops to 11US and 12US on Tuesday 6th July 2021. Ian gave a masterclass on the elements of settings in stories and how to stretch our “*imagination*” to talk about and create interesting settings. The pupils even got the opportunity to get up and role play being elements within their own setting. This inspired the pupils to draw and write about their own settings for a story, sparking some fantastic descriptive vocabulary.

POP Up SEND Literacy Festival

Ellie Sandall:

Incredibly talented children's picture book author and illustrator Ellie Sandall visited Chadsgrove on Friday 2nd July and delivered engaging, captivating and memorable workshops with the pupils of 6LS and 8LS.

Both of Ellie's workshops were interactive – featuring opportunities for the children to draw, write, explore their senses, dress up and create.

6LS - 'Everybunny Dream':

6LS pupils were very excited to be meeting a real author! And they haven't stopped talking about it since! They want Ellie to come back again soon!

Ellie read the text and the children joined in with the actions, acting the story out, (e.g. washing their faces, brushing their teeth, etc.), including putting their own soft toy fox cub to bed.

Ellie demonstrated how to draw a bunny and the pupils had a go themselves. They also made and decorated their own bunny ears before dressing up to create their own percussion band accompanying Ellie on her Ukulele to sing a bunny inspired action song to the tune of 'If you're happy and you know it, clap your hands'. Fantastic fun!

8LS - 'Copycat Bear':

8LS pupils were keen to share some of their own creative writing work with Ellie, inspired by their study of 'Copycat Bear', and Ellie was very impressed with their work.


Whilst sharing the story, pupils again joined in with the actions e.g. flapping their wings/paws, hopping from one foot to the other, etc. and joined in with the retelling.

The pupils also learnt how to draw the main characters from the story - Mango and Blue - learning to add texture to their pictures with blue oil pastels. They created their own 'Blue' masks before being transformed into the colourful bird 'Mango' to play a game of 'Mango Says' - a version of 'Simon Says', where the person wearing the bird mask asks the
