Weather Climate and Environment.

This term we are going to be finding out about hot and cold places in the world.

First look at the clips about Antarctica by following this link <u>https://www.bbc.co.uk/teach/class-clips-video/pshe-eyfs-ks1-go-jetters-continent-of-antarctica/zj9c382</u> and then have a go at doing some of the activities below.

Remember the Arctic is an area of frozen ocean mostly surrounded by land and the **Antarctic** is an area of frozen land surrounded by ocean.

Questions

- 1. What does the land look like in Antarctica?
- 2. Find out about the animals that live in the Antarctic such as the different types of Penguins and Whales and create some drawings and facts about these.
- 3. Make a 3D model of Antarctica using old cereal boxes, paint them white or cover them with white paper. Don't forget to add mountains.
- 4. Be an explorer, do some fieldwork in your garden and explore a new view or something not noticed before. What can you see?

Now let us look at hot places like a desert. Look at the clip on the Sahara desert <u>https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/topics/zx882hv/articles/zsqnfg8</u> and then have a go at doing some of the activities below.

Questions

- 1. What does the land look like? What might you see a lot of?
- 2. Can you find out more about the animals that would live in the desert? What do they eat and where do they sleep?
- 3. Can you paint/draw a picture of a desert?
- 4. Do any plants grow in the desert, can you find out facts about them?
- 5. Can you find other information on the internet about the desert and the Antarctic?

Now can you pretend that you are going to one of the places that you have been learning about? You need to pack a suitcase, can you make a list or draw what you would need to take with you on your visit? You can use the suitcase picture below to put your items in.
