8LS have been working hard in Food-tech making our very own pizza! We used all of our senses while deciding what toppings to put on the top. Yum yum.












12US

Bookbuzz

Chadsgrove School once again participated in the 'Bookbuzz' programme this year. 'Bookbuzz' is a reading programme from 'BookTrust' which supports schools to encourage reading for pleasure, celebrates independent choice and helps to develop a

whole school reading culture. As part of this programme, nearly 50 pupils (from Year 7 and above) have had the opportunity to choose their own book to keep from a list of 17 high quality titles suitable for 11-year-olds* and selected by a panel of experts. (*Including titles selected for Special Schools.)

This year, our pupils chose a range of titles from across a number of different genres. However, the most popular choice was 'Animal Antics'; a beautiful book packed with amazing pictures capturing the funniest, cutest, most interesting moments from the animal kingdom. I'm sure our pupils will enjoy reading their new books for pleasure both in school and at home.













'Time to Read' Packs

Chadsgrove School is participating in the BookTrust's 'Time to Read' programme again this year.


Through their 'Time to Read' programme, BookTrust want to make sure that every Reception pupil in England has their own book to treasure and share with their family

at home. Therefore, BookTrust is sending out book packs to every reception-aged child in England. In 2021 each pack includes a free copy of *I Am a Tiger* by Karl Newson and Ross Collins (published by Pan Macmillan). '*I am a Tiger*' is a charming story to read together, with simple text and bold illustrations, this is a lovely book to read aloud and to share. We hope these packs will spark every child's imagination, improve language and listening as well as encouraging the development of more practical skills such as making new friends and dealing with change. Reading together regularly as a family will also create a safe space for children to express themselves and is a great way to bond as a family. Our Reception pupils have already received their 'Time to read' packs. We hope our parent carers will enjoy sharing this FREE book with their child.
