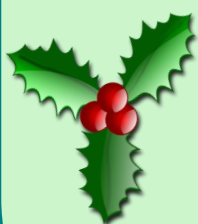
2LS Enjoying the Play

Meet our Class Guinea Pigs

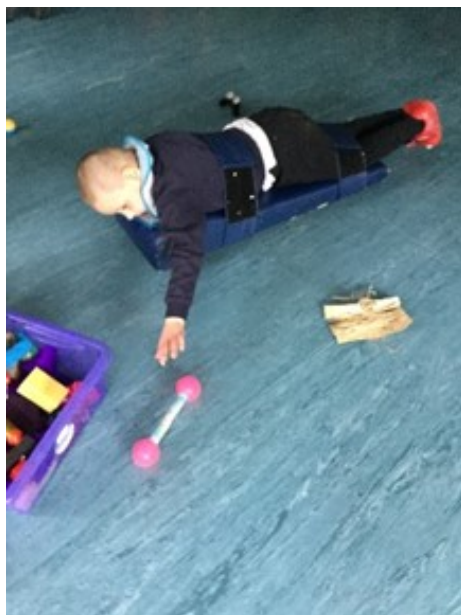

We each had a go, using a special small bell and tricorne hat!

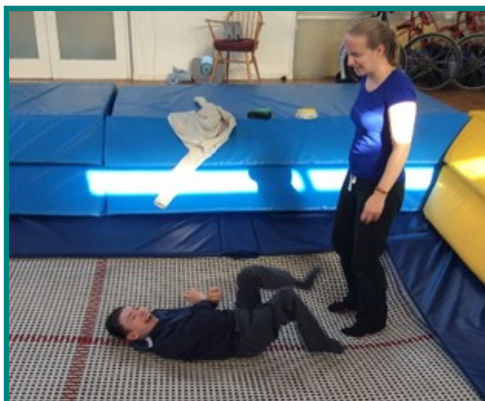

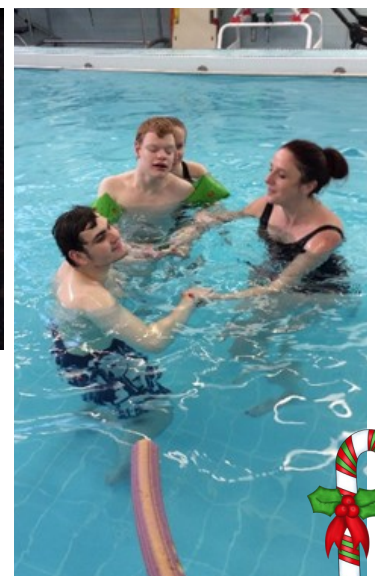
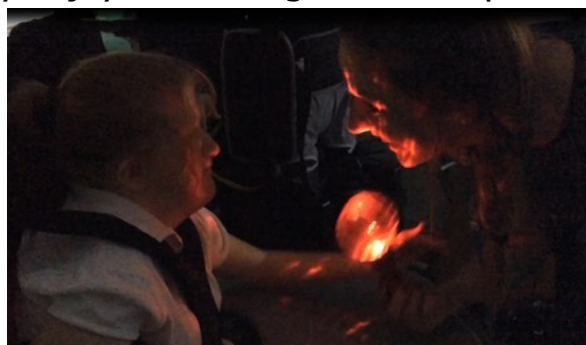
12US Enjoying the build up to Christmas

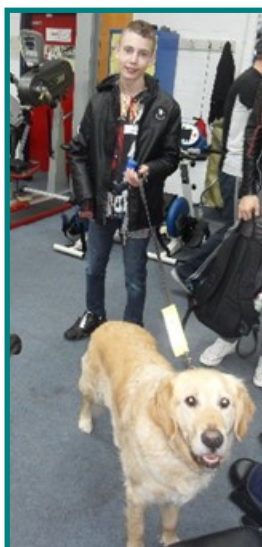


WHERE NEXT

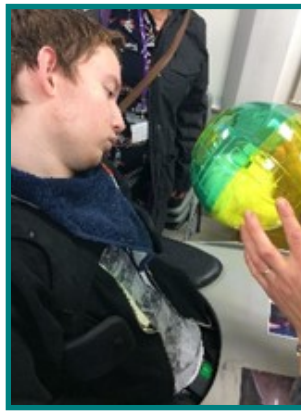
GLASSHOUSE

Glasshouse College is housed in a former glass factory in the heart of Stourbridge's Glass Quarter, it comprises an array of craft workshops, social enterprises, studios for local artisans, a performing arts centre, and the 40-acre Vale Head Farm set in the surrounding hillside. Crafts at Glasshouse draw from the local traditions of glass blowing and etching, as well as the performing arts, woodland management, and farm work. Pupils from 15US were invited to join students in a glass etching and glass blowing demonstration.



HALESOWEN COLLEGE

Halesowen College provide a wide range of courses and has a reputation for high standards, an excellent learning environment and a caring, supportive sense of community. They offer exceptional support and opportunities for students making the transition from school to further education. 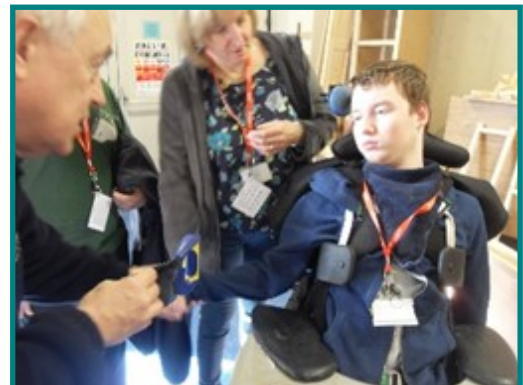


HEREWARD COLLEGE

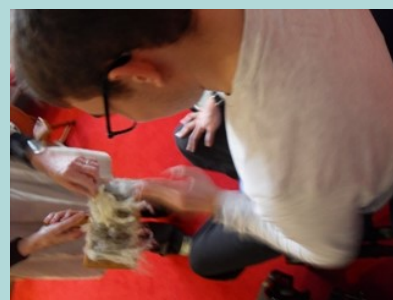
KIDDERMINSTER COLLEGE

15US VISIT TO THE MUSEUM OF CARPETS IN KIDDERMINSTER

15US have been working on a weaving project in art and as part of this project they enjoyed a lovely visit to the carpet museum in Kidderminster. They got involved in some hands on activities which included producing yarn from wool (the old fashioned way using carding and spinning!) and weaving (by hand). Demonstrations took place on how carpets were produced on both the hand loom and the power loom.

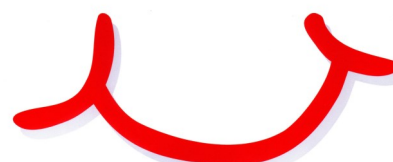
